



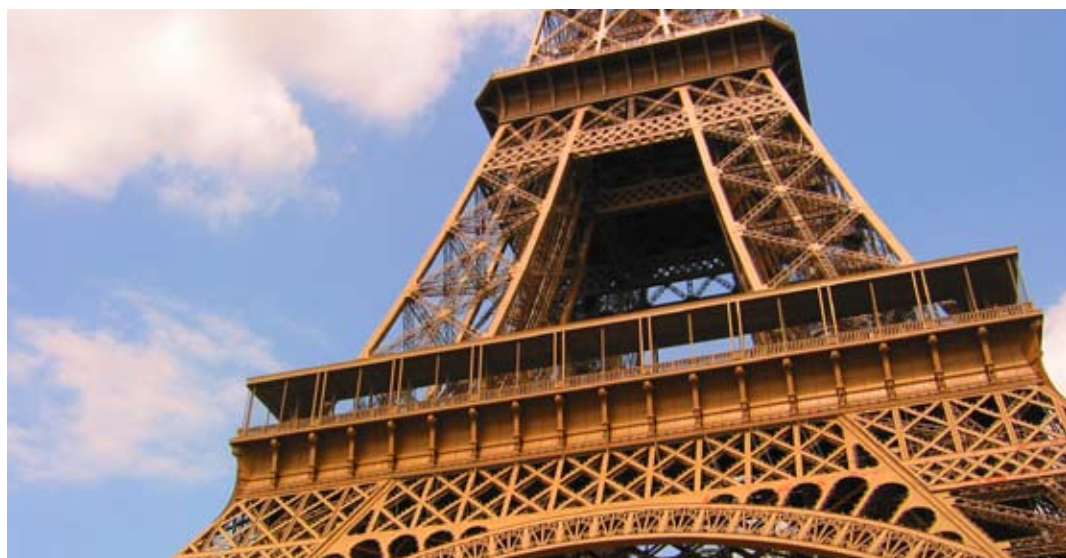

Tour de France 2010

... spectator tour

This tour has been designed for the non cyclist or 'spectators and fans', who wish to experience the world's greatest bicycle race, while enjoying one of the most culturally rich countries in the world.

This is not a cycling tour but a tour that offers French culture, manic Tour de France stage viewing and some good living mixed in! Our 10 day/ 9 night tour allows you to see stage starts, passages of the race as it passes through rural areas & small town & villages, and of course, the finale along the Champs Elysees in Paris.



The tour commences in Toulouse, where we have access to the race for the late stages where the ultimate podium finishers are going to be revealed. From Toulouse, we travel into the Pyrenees to see the race cross the biggest climbs and we'll enjoy famous southern hospitality and pristine beauty of the Pyrenees Mountains. We'll wind our way back toward the Bordeaux vineyards before travelling by train to Paris and your chance to see the big finish on the vaunted Champs Elysees

There is an emphasis of course for us to follow the Tour; however we will enjoy other tourist opportunities along the way. This is a different experience from the normal or standard tour that most people join in on but it's an exciting 10days watching the world's best cyclists in action, watching us do all the hard work of driving and navigating around France.

Please note: This itinerary is designed and developed to allow our participants to see as much of the race as possible. Road closures, traffic jams, thousands of people and logistical issues will and do play a role in what we actually see each day.

What we have listed for each day may change and all we ask of our participants is to 'enjoy the ride' with us as we follow the most exciting sporting event in the world. We endeavour to keep to our itinerary but this can change daily.

Day 1: Arrival day: Saturday July 17th

Today we will meet all the group participants at our hotel in Toulouse, capital of the Languedoc region. There's no reason why you shouldn't arrive a day earlier to explore this city's beautiful redbrick architecture and unique south-western character. We'll have a briefing about the tour, before watching stage 13 of the tour on television.

This evening we will enjoy a welcome dinner and taste the local dishes and wines.

This morning after breakfast, we'll make our way from Toulouse to a viewing point and lunch stop in the foothills of the Pyrénées Mountains, which intersects the race route of stage 14. It's a fun day with a party atmosphere created by numerous nationalities and many locals, all enjoying the summer sun and the hive of activity that is the Tour de France. Once the race passes, we may make our way to the small village of Foix and a local café where we can watch on TV, the mountain top finish on the Plateau de Bonascre. It's then a short drive to our hotel in Saint Girons.

This morning we will (with a bit of luck and providing road closures are not too severe), drive to Bagnères-de-Luchon to view the start of stage 16 in the town centre. We'll start early and settle in for a 90 minute drive. The pros will be up-close and relaxed as you walk the perimeter of the village to view the sign on ceremony, where each rider appears on stage. After this we'll buy picnic supplies for lunch, before making our way to Argeles, where we'll attempt to see the race again. It's then on to Lourdes for 3 nights.

Day 5: Wednesday July 21st

Today is a rest day for the professional cyclists in the Tour de France so it's a day of sightseeing in this beautiful part of the Pyrenees. It's a free day or you can visit the sights below.

Grottes de Betharram

The Betharram grottos are considered to be some of the most beautiful grottos in the world and are definitely the most interesting to visit because of their large variety of formations. They contain 5 separate stories superimposed like those

of a house, each formed during different eras. Discovered in 1810, they were one of the first grottos open to the public.

The Pic du Midi

The Pic du Midi de Bigorre is at an altitude of 2,877m and is famous for its astronomical observatory. It is accessed by a 15 minute cable car ride from La Mongie, at the foot of the Col du Tourmalet and the summit offers the most beautiful panorama of the Pyrenees Mountains.

The Pic du Jer

Located at the start of the Pyrenees and overlooks Lourdes, this site can be recognised by its large cross which shines at night. Take the 100-year-old chair-lift to the 1000m summit in only 6 minutes to see the fantastic views looking over Lourdes, Pau, Tarbes and the Pyrenees

The Basilica of the Rosary

Located in Lourdes, The Basilica of the Rosary is the major part of the vast architectural composition of the Sanctuaries of Lourdes. It has two large elliptical ramps directly in line with the esplanade and is an impressive sight. Of Byzantine-influenced Romanesque style, the Basilica of the Rosary represents a vast Greek cross measuring some 2,000m² in surface area. The enormous terraces embrace a vast square, where almost 80,000 people can gather to worship and pray. The monument offers ornamental Venetian mosaics, with its domes and chapels, reflecting the grand tradition of Byzantine architecture.

Day 6: Thursday July 22nd

Today is likely to be 'the stage' of the tour and will have thousands of spectators watching the cyclists will ride the stage from Pau to the summit of the famous Col du Tourmalet.

NOTE: This will be a very very busy day and road closures & traffic jams are expected. We will attempt to see the passage of the race as it makes its way to the mountain top finish on the Tourmalet. There will be walking involved so good walking shoes are recommended. It's then back to Lourdes after the peloton passes to see the finish on TV.

After breakfast, we'll make our way towards the vineyards of St Emilion. It's approximately 400kms, so we will have an opportunity to have lunch and possibly visit a winery along the way. This region is the most important wine producing region in France and Bordeaux has about 7,000 chateaux. We do not expect to see the tour today but we'll have time to explore the beautiful St Emilion before dinner.

Tonight is our last night together, so we will have a group farewell dinner to celebrate the finish to a memorable 10 days.
